We, the undersigned faculty mentor and student members of Jalal-Abad International University (JAIU), are pleased to submit this formal proposal for the establishment and official recognition of the EJSMR-JAIU Research Club for the period October 2025 – October 2026.

The club is initiated in close collaboration with the Eurasian Journal of Scientific and Multidisciplinary Research (EJSMR) (www.ejsmr.org) and aims to systematically strengthen the research culture among JAIU students across scientific and multidisciplinary fields, with particular emphasis on medical and health sciences.

1. Background and Rationale


Jalal-Abad International University hosts more than 5,000 international students from over 20 countries, creating a uniquely diverse academic environment. Despite this richness, many talented students lack structured guidance in research methodology, scientific writing, topic selection, ethical considerations, and pathways to publication and conference presentation.

The EJSMR-JAIU Research Club is designed to bridge this gap, foster a sustainable research ecosystem, and elevate JAIU's international academic visibility through high-quality student-led research and publications.

October 2025 - October 2026 (academic year), with the possibility of renewal based on performance evaluation.

5. Objectives

- Develop research competence in methodology, critical appraisal, and academic writing
- Assist students in formulating feasible and impactful research questions
- Facilitate submission and publication in reputable peer-reviewed journals (particularly EJSMR and partner journals)
- Prepare members for national and international conferences
- Promote interdisciplinary and intercultural research collaboration
- Contribute to JAIU's research output and global ranking

6. Initial Research Topics and Teams (2025 -2026 cycle)

The club has already identified the following student-led projects, which will receive mentoring and aim for publication within the first 18 months:

- 1. Dheeru, Vaishnavi & Shifa "Applications of Artificial Intelligence in Modern Diagnostics and Treatment"
- 2. Tsering Youden "Neural Networks and Cognitive Load Assessment in Medical Education and Clinical Practice"
- 3. Tushar Kalange "Dynamics of Brucellosis Incidence in Urban Regions of Central Asia"
- 4. Deivanai Kumar & Swapnil Khadka "Adaptation to Climate Change and Its Health Implications among International Students in Kyrgyzstan"
- 5. Mominzhanova Samira "Intercultural Communication and Adaptation of International Students at Jalal-Abad International University: Barriers and Pathways to Integration"

These topics reflect both local public-health priorities and global multidisciplinary challenges, ensuring relevance and feasibility.

7. Planned Activities

- Two official meetings per month (minimum 20 meetings per academic year)
- Monthly journal club and critical appraisal sessions
- Hands-on workshops on research design, biostatistics, EndNote/Zotero, plagiarism prevention, and manuscript preparation
- Individual and small-group mentoring for ongoing projects
- Organization of an annual JAIU Student Research Day/Conference
- Invited guest lectures (online and in-person) from international experts
- Support for conference abstract submission and travel-grant applications

8. International Collaboration

The club has established a formal cooperation agreement with Eurac Research (Bolzano, Italy) – Institute for Mountain Emergency Medicine (www.eurac.edu). Areas of joint interest include:

- High-altitude medicine and acute mountain sickness
- Sports and exercise physiology in mountainous environments
- Emergency medicine in remote and extreme settings

Eurac Research has committed to providing online training modules, co-supervision of selected projects, expert review of manuscripts, and potential short-term research internships in Italy for outstanding club members.

9. Expected Outcomes by November 2026

- Minimum 15–20 manuscripts submitted for publication
- At least 5–7 papers published with JAIU affiliation
- Participation of club members in ≥3 international conferences
- Creation of a replicable student research mentorship model
- Significant enhancement of JAIU's research profile and international partnerships

10. Institutional Collaboration and Coordination

Upon approval by the Rector, the club will work in close coordination with:

- The Office of the Vice-Rector for Research and Science (for alignment with university research strategy and ethical clearance procedures)
- The Dean's Office of the Faculty of Medicine (for integration into faculty academic activities, access to laboratories/clinical data where required, and dissemination among medical students)

Regular progress reports will be submitted to both offices.

11. Requested Support (Minimal and Feasible)

- 1. Official recognition of the EJSMR-JAIU Research Club
- 2. Allocation of a dedicated seminar/room twice monthly (2–3 hours each)
- 3. Permission to use JAIU logo, letterhead, and official email domain for club correspondence and conference applications
- 4. Announcement of the club via university website (www.jaiu.kg), social media, and faculty notice boards
- 5. Facilitation of ethical clearance for student projects through the university's research ethics committee
- 6. Possible modest financial assistance for printing posters/banners and light refreshments during major events (detailed budget available upon request)

No dedicated budget line or full-time personnel is requested; all activities will be managed voluntarily by the mentor and coordinator. We are confident that the EJSMR-JAIU Research Club will make a tangible and lasting contribution to the academic excellence and global reputation of Jalal-Abad International University.
